1. Executive Summary

The Early Start Africa ECD program at Korr Centre continued to deliver quality early childhood education throughout 2025, contributing significantly to the holistic development of children and the overall well-being of their families and the wider community. The program recorded positive outcomes in learning achievement, child behavior, parental engagement, and increased community awareness on the importance of early childhood education.

2. Program Overview

In addition, parents observed that children shared knowledge acquired at school, particularly in basic reading and counting.

These interactions strengthened parent-child relationships and increased parental appreciation for early childhood education. Families expressed increased trust and confidence in the ECD program and its long-term benefits.

5. Community-Level Outcomes

At the community level, the program recorded increased enrolment and sustained school attendance among children, reflecting growing confidence in the ECD center. Community members expressed optimism about the future of their children and acknowledged education as a critical driver of sustainable development.

Local leaders commended the program for its contribution to child protection, noting a reduction in cases of early marriage and child labour as more children remained enrolled in school. The program has also enhanced community awareness on the importance of investing in early childhood education.

6. Stakeholder Feedback

Feedback from parents, community members, and local leadership was overwhelmingly positive. Stakeholders acknowledged that the ECD program has fostered growth, hope, and unity within families and across the wider community, and emphasized the importance of sustaining and expanding the initiative.
